

Sungudi (Tie and dye)

Sungudi or the Tie and Dye technology was brought from Gujarat 600 years ago by migrating Sourashtrians. Sungudi dots or rather diamonds, are shade larger than Bandhini sarees which are characterized by small dots.. Each Sungudi saree will have at least 10000 to 21000 dots. Single saree will take up to 15 days to produce and are made with cotton sarees only. The weavers derived inspiration for the dotted patterns of 'Sungudi' from the stars in the sky. and they came up with the idea of tie-and-dye method after seeing women knot their hair.
